- To have a valid First Aid / Basic Life Support (BLS) Certificate of Completion
- Be competent in written and spoken English in order to be able to communicate effectively with patients, their families and dental and healthcare professionals

How Is The Course Delivered?

The sessions are delivered virtually via live zoom classes timetabled once-a-month. Additional supporting materials will be available on our virtual learning environment (eTrain). These include lecture slides, past video lessons, suggested reading materials and other key resources.

Record Of Competence

Successful completion of a work-based Record of Competence (RoC) is a programme requirement. The RoC consists of three sections:

Practical Competence Assessment Sheets (PCAS)

Case studies

Supplementary outcomes

Supplementary Outcomes

The assessment comprises a 90-minute written examination with two sections:

Part A – 45 multiple-choice questions (MCQ)

Part B – 30 extended matching questions (EMQ)

Examinations are conducted biannually in March and September.

Qualification Attainment

To secure this qualification, candidates must:

1. Successfully complete and fulfil the requirements of the Record of Competence (RoC).

2. Pass the examination
